

Care Homes and The Mental Capacity Act 2005

A One Day Course

The Mental Capacity Act 2005 has a considerable impact on care homes. Many activities performed by care home staff are covered by the Act such as, feeding, bathing, giving medication, nursing care and accompanying residents outside the home. People affected include those with dementia, learning disabilities, confusion (due to illness, treatment or drug/alcohol misuse), brain injury or mental health problems. Managers and staff need to know how the Act will affect them and their working practices to ensure legal protection.

This course provides the essential knowledge care home staff need in order to work with and implement the Act effectively, ensuring compliance with the legislation. Practical issues in using the legislation are considered and addressed.
