

WORKING WITH PERSONALITY DISORDERS

(A ONE DAY COURSE)

The programme looks at the difficulties faced by this often misunderstood and sometimes 'difficult' client group from both the service user and mental health workers' perspectives. It aims to provide introductory training in working with people who have personality disorders and break some of the misconceptions often that surround them.

A Diagnosis of Exclusion? **'Working with Personality Disorders'** is appropriate for mental health staff such as Support Workers, Ward Staff, Student Nurses, O.T.s, CMHT Workers and anybody that has a professional interface with this client group in either the voluntary or statutory sectors.
