

ADVANCE DECISIONS (MENTAL CAPACITY ACT 2005)

A half day course

Advance decisions (formerly known as living wills or advance directives under the common law) came into force in October 2007 with the introduction of the Mental Capacity Act 2005. The use of advance decisions by patients is likely to increase over time as awareness of the Act increases. Valid and applicable advance decisions have legal authority and are binding upon staff consequently, staff must be prepared to work with them and understand their impact.

This course provides the essential knowledge that healthcare staff and others need to work with advance decisions effectively and ensure compliance with the legislation. Practical issues including the limits and challenges of advance decisions are addressed.
